

O'Flynn takes Cork to the top of the class



Cork city reached even greater heights last week with the opening of The Elysian, the three-acre complex of luxurious apartments and retail units developed by the O'Flynn Group. It is now the country's tallest building, outdoing Liberty Hall in Dublin by 11 metres.

Prices for the one-bedroom apartments start at €375,000 and go right up to €2m for the triplex penthouses.

"The multi-million Elysian is now Cork's most prestigious address and the name for the most luxurious apartments in Ireland, and you'll find them right in the heart of Cork City," said Trish Stokes of sales agent Sherry FitzGerald.

"Set in three acres, next to City Hall, you are promised a private and unique inner garden spectacle, unlike anything this side of Japan, created by Japanese and Irish craftsmen and incorporating mature specimen trees, stone, water cascades and a central sculpture of copper, coming together to provide an oasis in the heart of the City, surrounded by the most beautiful apartments in Ireland.

"This is a unique upmarket development and beautiful living environment with all the advantages of a city centre setting."

The Elysian was designed by Wilson Architecture and the apartment interiors are by internationally renowned design group Taylor Howes Designs of London. The landscaping is by the team that designed and built the multiple Gold Award winning Irish Garden in the World Expo 90, in Osaka, Japan.

The overall development consists of 211 luxury apartments including 37 penthouse apartments, with secure underground car parking. A concierge facility will be available, the basement car park has over 550 car spaces, and retail, restaurant, crèche and gym facilities at ground level. The apartments are set around a podium garden park of trees and water features for apartment owners to relax or exercise.
